After a strong first day of debate, the committee explored many different perspectives on migration. Some delegations supported welcoming migrants and saw benefits in diversity and growth, while others concerned about economic, social, and environmental problems. Discussions also included equality between countries, national image, and the importance of international cooperation. To start Day 2, the committee is expected to focus on building solutions to manage migration and address the issue of illegal migration in a fair and effective way.

The committee split into two groups with different views on migration. Both supported legal migration and were against illegal migration, but one group, led by Japan, wanted more restrictions to protect the country. Colombia, South Korea, Spain, and Germany joined this group. The other group, led by Argentina, supported migration with fewer restrictions, focusing on inclusion and growth. Peru, Guatemala, Brazil, and the USA were part of this second group.

The session continued with both groups defending their solutions. Group 1, led by Japan, argued that strong restrictions are necessary to protect their countries. They promoted actions like expanding deportation, punishing illegal entry, and building more border walls. On the other hand, Group 2, led by Argentina, said that migrants deserve better opportunities. They explained that most people migrate looking for safety, jobs, or a better future, and countries should support them instead of closing their doors.

During the debate, important and powerful countries in terms of migration like Brazil and the USA changed from Group 2 to Group 1. They explained that even though they support migration, they need more control to protect their countries. They said that without order, the country can become insecure, which affects tourism and causes people to leave. They also mentioned that if opportunities decrease and migrants enter without control, the economy and national growth could suffer.

1:30pm

To conclude, two resolutions were proposed (one from each group), but the final one approved was from Group 1 led by Japan and Colombia. It supports stronger control over migration, with deportations, punishments for illegal entry, and stricter borders to protect national security. It passed because most countries supported it.
