## 9:18am

The Human Rights Council promotes dialogue and cooperation to defend human rights, the committee will be focusing on the right to education for Latin American migrants, aiming to address the barriers migrant children face and propose solutions to ensure equal access to quality education.



## 9:10am

To ensure that migrants receive a good education, France suggested setting up separate schools from natives. In order to assist migrant kids, Colombia introduced a similar idea introducing language instructors to public schools. France demonstrated a spirit of cooperation by accepting this suggestion. On the other hand, the United States of America proposed the establishment of migration centers to assist with the documentation and management of the migrant population. Afghanistan agreed with that notion. In the meantime, Colombia, the United States, Venezuela, and Brazil backed France's anti-racism and anti-xenophobia initiatives.

### -10:55am

The United States emphasized the importance of legalizing immigrants so they can receive a basic education. Venezuela recommended that other countries provide financial assistance to help Latin America expand its school infrastructure and improve its education system. Nicaragua expressed concern about the distribution of educational materials to migrant students. Argentina echoed France's response that national taxes would be used to fund these items. Finally, Colombia suggested relaxing its immigration regulations to facilitate the einscription of migrant children in school.

#### 11:53am

The delegations of Germany, Ecuador, Canada and Nicaragua made a presentation portraying a solution to accept migrant kids without any type of document in schools. Delegations of Venezuela, United States of America and the republic of French disagreed with idea of the delegations of Germany, Canada, Ecuador and Nicaragua.
